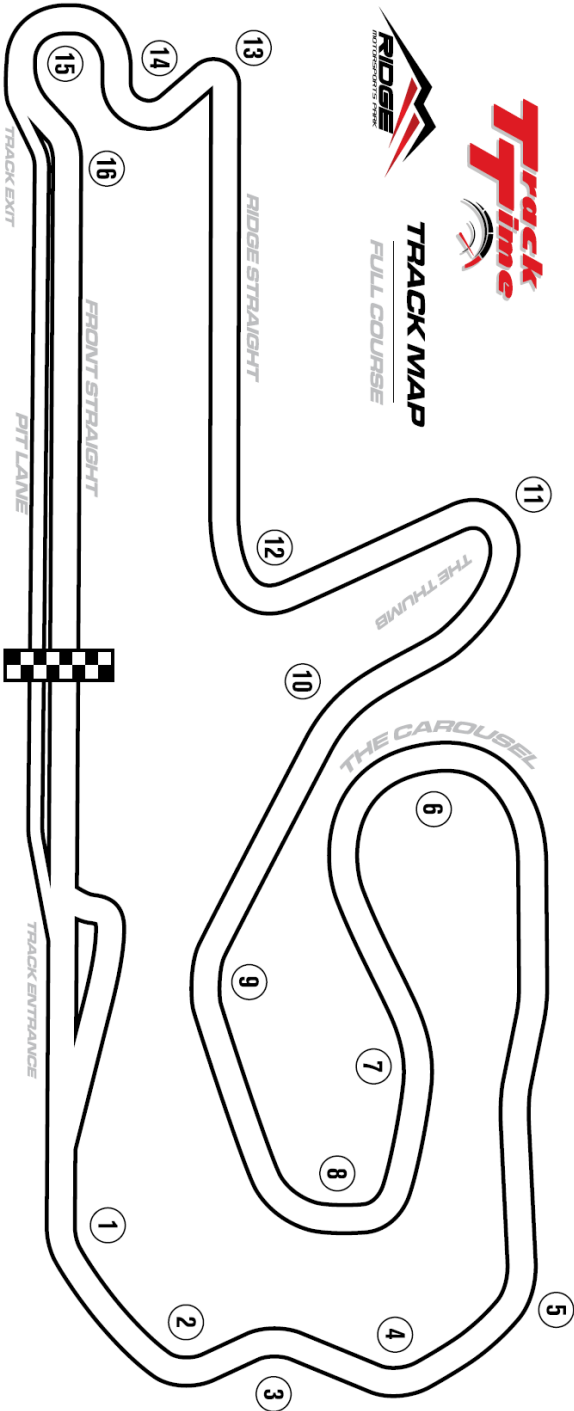

Racer Profile

WMRRA Racer: DC Forbes

When did you start racing and How did you get into it?

I officially started racing 2 years ago after my last and youngest daughter "grew up and moved out" (An ignoble, self-indulgent attempt at 'adulthood'). Honestly though, I have been interested and riding motorcycles since an early age. In my formative years it was dirt bikes. As a teenager a Suzuki GS250T and then as a young man; a CX500, Vulcan 800 and my first "sport bike" the Buell XB1 Lightning. Um yeah, unfortunately ate itself up after 5000 miles. Traded that in for a '98 Superhawk and found a group of like-minded sport bike enthusiasts at Cycle Barn--Been terrorizing riding local roads and hanging around the track ever since, watching some of them race as I raised kids, rode roads, and did some corner working. Josh Ellingson, Kevin Bloudoff, Jake Frame, Liz Chaffin, and Rich King (R.I.P. RK ❤️ 55) are all friends of mine who have influenced me to pursue racing, be it good, bad, or otherwise!

What bike(s) do you ride/classes do you race in?

LWSS / LWSBK, Ninja 400. These classes are noisy, EXTREMELY competitive- I would highly recommend looking at other classes before considering these ones [...]. I also have a 2008 R6 that I am practicing with, and an eye on the middle weight twins like the R7 or Ape 660 in the very near future. We'll see....

What have been your greatest accomplishments in racing?

Literally, 2nd place! ...and finishing, that's a great accomplishment, right? No first place medals, yet. But that's what keeps us showing up, no? Best moment in racing for sure though, has to be flying under the bridge at The Ridge, wiping the rain off my visor and watching as two smaller bikes, drop anchor at the end of the wall, and watching them (me!) fly right on by. I start my braking cycle well into the paint that separates the entry lane from the track proper. Tip in, first left, then right. Pin the throttle on the little Ninja, then through turn one, two, and up the hill to 3 with no competitors in sight. Years of commuting in the PNW has paid dividends in spades with the confidence of racing in the rain. Wait, what? Wet? Whatever!?! Get some!

What do you tend to work on the most Or What do you struggle with?

I struggle most with bad habits. Left-over, self-taught street riding techniques that compromise proper race technique and efficacy. Back brake, what is that? Except at the highest level, or off road, who is it good for? Training at track days, shout out to 2Fast and Track Time!, this is invaluable for progressing past this. What I work on the most is ABSOLUTE, TOTAL, removal of "oh-shit" moments. Practice, Qualifying, and a Race with no frantic "...damn, I barely made it" moments is the goal. Plan ahead, muscle memory, practice-like-you-play, execute, is the winning profile.

Rider Profile (Cont.)

What advice did you receive when you first started that you found to be the most helpful?

“Look where yo want to go” not at the problem in front of you. I have avoided situations, both on and off the track by visualizing where I wanted to put my tires and the bike.

What would you tell someone who wants to race or is just getting started?

Start! Do a taste-of-racing, or three, Do some track days and get some instruction, again shout out to 2Fast and Track Time! Then sign up for novice racing! There is plenty of resources, support, and info to get going. Heck, call me, I'll make things happen, or Damon, yeah, he's your better bet!

What does WMRRR mean to you?

A community of like-minded individuals, a group of friends, and a 100 strong pit crew! I've seen an entire class of participants pull together to restore a competitor's bike so they can race the next day! This is a great club, and I think you will get more out of it than you put into it, but yeah it will be as awesome as you make it!
