Welcome and Introductions

The meeting began with participants joining and discussing technical issues with meeting access links. The group briefly discussed the possibility of starting a CFMoto class for cheaper Chinese motorcycles.

NRS School Event Feedback Review

Discussed feedback from the recent NRS school event, with participants reporting they were overwhelmed by the amount of information presented. Key issues identified included confusion around the registration process, particularly regarding licenses and membership, and difficulties accessing the Motorsports registration platform. Tico suggested improving the onboarding process for new racers and creating better documentation, including a recording of the session. The team also noted that while the Zoom component worked for most participants, there were some technical issues, particularly for Canadian attendees.

Racing Season Preparation Updates

Discussion regarding racing season preparations. Kumpy reported that CSM moving services will transport air fences between locations, with coordination handled by Kumpy and Chris Lafayette. Neil provided a financial update, confirming that after paying the first round track rental of approximately \$31,000, the club has \$10,600 in checking and \$33,000 in business investment accounts, with

additional sponsorship income of \$11-12,000 received so far this year. Neil also mentioned an upcoming \$1,266 annual directors and officers insurance payment that needs approval. CJ confirmed that Dane Anar will be returning as a photographer this year, with media credentials to be handled by Danielle.

Middleweight Class Lap Requirements Discussion

Discussed potential changes to the middleweight class lap requirements. Chris explained the complexity of the issue, noting that consistency across lightweight and middleweight races would be challenging. The group ultimately decided to maintain the current 6-lap format for middleweight races during the first round, with the possibility of making adjustments after gathering feedback.

Race Materials Updates

Tico presented updates on race materials, including new plaques under \$5 each and two t-shirt designs, including a limited "No Lean Gene" design and a season t-shirt with sponsor logos. The group also discussed paddock maps, with Jennifer and Tico agreeing that while maps can help guide participants, they cannot be strictly enforced as they rely on self-policing.

Sponsorship and Race Updates

Discussion of upcoming events and logistics. Questions about Moto America and air fence usage, deciding not to offer it unless specifically requested. Damon provided an update on the NRS program, noting that the classroom portion was complete and the on-track portion was upcoming. Discussed implementing roving tech for \$20, with Paul suggesting a system using a visible indicator, like a bright red paper or cone, to track which riders had paid for the service.

Novice Racing Event Logistics Planning

Discussed logistics for handling novices during racing events, the potential challenges of managing a large number of new novice riders on Friday night, and the need for additional help with tech inspections and registration. Chris suggested that tech checks should be done at the beginning of the day rather than end of day to give novices maximum time for repairs. Damon emphasized the importance of ensuring all novices attend the riders meeting and proposed implementing a more serious approach to attendance tracking, including potential fines or disqualification for non-attendance. Discussed plans for conducting makeup NRS sessions, with Damon working with OMRRRA to accommodate participants who missed the classroom or on-track portions, and seeking help to set up online Zoom access for Canadian participants.

Racing Events Operational Updates

Discussed several operational updates and logistics for upcoming racing events. Danielle requested Zoom recordings of the NRS session and a booklet to address repeated questions from participants, particularly about bike classifications. Craig reported on registration trailer tab renewals and discussed challenges in securing staff lunches through the ridge, ultimately deciding to continue with previous arrangements of pizza and Subway for approximately \$10-12 per person.

Financial Discrepancies and Staff Payments

CJ discussed financial discrepancies with board members regarding staff payments. CJ clarified that race day staff management falls under his responsibility and requested that Kumpy redirect future inquiries about Elijah and other race day matters to him. They also discussed a request from Rick about an assistant, which CJ needs to review.

Operational and Financial Concerns

Kumpy and CJ discussed several operational matters including payment verification for CSM, insurance coverage, and financial concerns. CJ expressed frustration about unclear insurance costs and payment structures, particularly regarding additional insured requirements and potential rate changes. They also reviewed race scheduling changes, with CJ explaining decisions to modify lap counts and race times to maximize revenue while maintaining appropriate buffers between events. The conversation concluded with CJ planning to address financial discrepancies and payment issues with the Board of Directors.

Closing and Next Meetings

The next meeting was scheduled for April 15th at 7pm to finalize preparations before the first round of racing.
